

CHIEF'S MINUTE(s)

February 9, 2022

- Incidents** – January 2022 29 total, 14 medical, 1 structure, 6 mva, 0 natural cover, 4 public safety/assist, 3 False alarms, 1 haz. Condition. Structure response was auto aid to Dist 2.
- Training** – Training included safety/OSHA/equipment night, CPR recertification night, fire attack training at the Dist. 2 drill tower, and Rapid Intervention Team (RIT) training.
- Firefighters** - FFs completed AED/CPR. Planning regional spring wildland fire drill with rest of county, will take place at several sites within Lookingglass and Tenmile.
- Explorers** - Participated in all ff tasks.
- Equipment** - New battery for 1091. Door repair on Water tender 1060 completed in house, saved \$
- Inventory** - VFA grant invoices submitted for reimbursement (\$9532). Last hose arrived, inventoried, and put into stock. Ordered flash hoods to maintain stock.
- SCBAs – Met with Cascade Fire, they will still handle our required mask Fit testing in future at a reduced price. Cascade showed new 4 gas monitor for possible purchase FY 22-23.
- Facility** Did facility OSHA equipment check, fuel oil at ½ tank.
- Office/Admin** – SDAO annual conference – registered for multiple courses and will be available on line to Board also. Virtual only February 10-12.
- Next year's property liability policy invoice for approval tonight.
- Website up and running, "under construction" still but meeting the requirements. Continue to update and add new material. Will put up spring material and remove Christmas/winter prevention posts.
- Over 90% of taxes have been deposited, received \$5500 more this week.
- Met with seismic grant contractor, went over building plans and upcoming steps. Submitting application material this week. Soliciting support letters from County and local agencies to help with the grant process.
- Annual State hazmat survey due and working on it. Totaling up annual incidents for 2021 and preparing for annual report for March meeting.
- Annual FEMA/SAM update due and working on it also. Will add current Board Members to our profile.
- State of Oregon is distributing COVID-19 test kits through rural fire departments. We received an initial allotment of 90 which we are distributing to the public. The County's goal is to have them in all residences so that people may self-test when they feel ill before going to school or work. Local residents can contact us for a test kit for each member of their families.
- Local budget training available online and the process will start again in April, coming soon.
